

❖ 브래킷 방향 변경하기

1. 카메라 뒷면의 브래킷 노브를 시계 반대 방향 (왼쪽)으로 돌려 분리하세요.




 아래 그림과 같이 브래킷 노브와 카메라의 위치를 바꾸고 브래킷 노브를 끼운 후 시계 방향(오른쪽)으로 돌려 고정시키세요.



❖ 목재 벽면에 설치할 경우

1. 카메라의 브래킷 스탠드에 있는 고무패킹을 제거하세요.



- 2. 설치하려는 벽면에 2개의 나사를 이용하여 제품을 벽에 고정시키세요.
 - ▶메라 설치 시 케이블이 눌리지 않도록 브래킷 스탠드의 배선 홈 사이로 케이블을 넣으세요.




3. 고무패킹을 다시 원래 위치에 덮어주세요.



❖ 콘크리트 벽면에 설치함 경우


1. 카메라의 브래킷 스탠드에 있는 고무패킹을 제거하세요.




2. 먼저 설치하려는 벽면에 브래킷 스탠드를 대고 나사가 들어갈 위치를 표시하세요.



- 3. 표시된 위치에 직경 5mm 콘크리트용 드릴 비트와 드릴을 이용하여 약 3cm 깊이의 구멍을 뚫으세요.
 - 작업 후 구멍 안의 부스러기 등을 털어내세요.
 - 드릴 작업시 부상당하지 않도록 주의하세요.



4. 뚫은 구멍에 앵커를 삽입한 후, 앵커의 뒷면을 망치 또는 고무 망치를 이용하여 가볍게 때려 끝까지 삽입하세요.




- 5. 앵커가 삽입된 구멍 2곳에 나사를 이용하여 제품을 벽에 고정시키세요.

6. 고무패킹을 다시 원래 위치에 덮어주세요.


2. 브래킷 노브를 시계 방향으로 돌려 조이세요.



- 4. 스마트폰에 연결된 Wi-Fi 네트워크 정보가 표시되면 Wi-Fi 비밀번호를 입력하고 <다음> 을 누르세요.
- Wi-Fi 공유기의 비밀번호 (알파벳 대소문자 구분)가 정확하지 않으면 다음 진행 단계에서 등록이 되지 않으니 주의하세요
 - 공유기 비밀번호가 틀려 카메라 등록이 실패하면 카메라 LED는 파란색 점멸과 노란색 점등을 반복합니다. 이럴 경우 카메라 RESET 버튼을 8초간 눌러 초기화시킨 후에 재시도 바랍니다.
 - 5 GHz 주파수 대역의 Wi-Fi는 지원하지 않습니다. 스마트폰을 반드시 2.4 GHz 주파수 대역의 WI-FI 네트워크에 연결하세요.
 - WPA Enterprise 인증 방식은 지원하지 않습니다. 공유기 웹 페이지에 접속하거나, 가입한 통신사에 문의하면 공유기 인증 방식을 확인할 수 있습니다

The GNU General Public License is a free, copyleft

Preamble

The licenses for most software are designed to take away your freedom to share and change it. By contrast, the GNU General Public Licenses are intended to guarantee your freedom to

share and change free software to make sure the software is free for all its users.

This license, the Lesser General Public License, applies to some specially designated software packages-typically libraries-of the Free Software Foundation and other authors who decide to use it. You can use it too, but we suggest you first think carefully about whether this license or the ordinary General Public License is the better strategy to use in any particular case, based on the explanations below.

When we speak of free software, we are referring to freedom of use, not price. Our General Public Licenses are designed to make sure that you have the freedom to distribute copies of free software (and charge for this service if you wish); that you receive source code or can get it if you want it; that you can change the software and use pieces of it in new free programs; and that you are informed that you can do these things.
